The First Interim State Public Health Plan is divided into two Parts.

Once Part 5, section 43 of the Public Health Act 2016 is enacted, it requires the State Public Health Plan to:
 identify the public health needs of the State and include an examination of data relating to the health status and health determinants in the State
Health status refers to an individual's or population's overall level of health, taking into account various factors such as life expectancy, amount of disability, and levels of disease risk factors.
Health determinants are the conditions in which people are born, grow up, live, work and age. These conditions influence a person's opportunity to be healthy, his/her risk of illness and life expectancy.
